# 1.3 Data Protection changes

# 1.4 Broadband

Digital Derbyshire is unhappy with Openreach proposals and told them to come back with a better set in January. W3Z has offered free internet for 18 months to the Institute if they can install and use the hall for a presentation. If more than 12 sign up they will be pleased to continue this foc arrangement. The Institute needs to apply for the £300 installation grant but no fees will be incurred on termination and any holes made good by W3Z.

Footpaths 18, 20, 23, 24 & 25 are mainly being used and the clerk is to clarify with the Peak Park Ranger/Rights of Way officer the status with a view to passing to the prosecuting authority.
