376 Planning decisions/applications received since last meeting & planning related matters

Decisions received : none

Applications for discussion: NP/DD1017/1053 Rockhouse Farm Common Lane – proposed open plan building to house fodder  
Council supports this application which is well back from the highway and uses approved materials.

NP/DDD/1017/1034 – Town End Barn – Erection of Timber shed for use as garden shed and hobbies room

Council supports this application. Its location will make it unnoticeable from most directions.

APP/M9496/D/17/3183270 – Burrs Farm conservatory appeal. Council has nothing to add to the already logged support comment.

377 Footpaths and Highways and related issues

378 Reports from Village Organisations –

Village Institute – AGM next week – the heating grant has been banked and the W3Z offer is being seriously considered. The quiz night was a great success.

Trust – website to be used to advertise available grants.

Festival – Meeting on 18<sup>th</sup> to finalise and distribute approx. £2100 to village organisations. This meeting will also be the start of the 2018 process with all the successes destined for repeat.

2018 Remembrance Beacon – will be on next agenda and a linked event in the Institute possibly with a video link to the Low and large poppies are considerations.

379 Report of the Clerk on: -

- 1.1 Village Assets/Website: a page on the Trust is to be created. The Playground annual inspection has been booked. The remaining trees need planting before it gets too cold.
- 1.2 Mowing contract – the additional price for the Green of £70p.a. is to be offered to formalise the arrangement.
- 1.3 Data Protection changes  
Central Government has decided that all levels of local government require an independent data protection officer. DALC is trying to find a way to cost effectively achieve this.
- 1.4 Broadband  
Digital Derbyshire is unhappy with Openreach proposals and told them to come back with a better set in January. W3Z has offered free internet for 18 months to the Institute if they can install and use the hall for a presentation. If more than 12 sign up they will be pleased to continue this foc arrangement. The Institute needs to apply for the £300 installation grant but no fees will be incurred on termination and any holes made good by W3Z.

The parishioner's letter was read by members and another incident between a motorcyclist and the RSPCA Officer on the footpaths relayed. Footpaths 18, 20, 23, 24 & 25 are mainly being used and the clerk is to clarify with the Peak Park Ranger/Rights of Way officer the status with a view to passing to the prosecuting authority.
