Decisions received: NP/DDD/0715/0624 Far Ditch farm – proposal to convert to 3 Holiday units – granted

NP/DDD/0415/0343 - Town End Farm, Main Street - Proposed agricultural unit - withdrawn

Applications for Discussion: NP/DDD/0715/0658 - Town End Farm - Proposed agricultural unit

Chelmorton Parish Council continues to object to this application due to its scale though is pleased to see the height has been reduced in the revised plans.

Council considers that a more acceptable length building would confine it to within the existing boundary stone walls ensuring that a gap is left between the rear boundary wall and the building itself to mask the lower blockwork. It also considers that the building should be timber clad down to the damp line with a fibre cement dark slate roof sheet.

The scale of the building demonstrates a need for a fuller case for appraisal of its agricultural needs as the potential increased activity with the access road passing in front of all the domestic properties on this site needing to be assessed.

## Caravan Club proposed site

No response has been received from the Club to our and the PDNPA objections. It is noted that the site appears to be already in use and the clerk is to write to the club regarding the lack of reply.

Dumping in the line of the Historic Ditch

The clerk is to enquire of the PDNPA whether the policy on protecting this landscape feature has changed as dumping waste building material within Field Number 618 (known as Thorn Yard) is going on at present in an area close to the line of the Chelmorton Boundary Ditch.
