

# CHELMORTON PARISH COUNCIL

## Public Land and building Assets

- 1) The allotments – The Ditch Chelmorton SK17 9SQ  
3 plots - **Plot 1** being 95' x 44' (470sq yds)  
**Plot 2** being 95' x 45' (475sq yds)  
**Plot 3** being 95' x 37' (390sq yds)
  
- 2) The Green – DY478359  
is a square area of grass in front of cottages of that address. It has a stone telephone box on one corner for which permission was granted on 4<sup>th</sup> September 1933 and is now a listed building owned and maintained by the Parish Council.  
Extracts from the Minute Books:  
24th March 1897 Meeting Proposed that the Old School Green be cleared for a recreation ground



- 3) The Troughs – DY478359  
are historic monuments owned and maintained by the PC alongside the highway.





- 4) Corner Green – DY478359  
is a wide grass area that has been the site of the Village Well-dressing in days gone by and also has a parish bench sited on it.



- 5) Illy Willy – DY488575  
This ancient spring and tank (that feeds the troughs (3)) is owned and maintained by the Parish Council and was also subject to major grant works by the PDNPA in 2005 to clean up and preserve as a monument.



#### 6. The Pound - DY359535

Was first rented out in 1897. It is mentioned in the minutes of 1899 as being 9 yards long and 5 yards broad.

In July 2004 the Pound had major restoration works carried out in conjunction with the Peak District National Park Authority and became a historic monument for the village. Since that time the Parish Council has continued to pay for the maintenance and upkeep of this area annually as a village asset – ie not rented out. In recent times the recycling bins have been stored there.





7. Bull Hey Dale 8.1 acres - DY386703

Agricultural land rented by the Parish Council to a tenant. Current agreement began on 25<sup>th</sup> March 2009 with 3 yearly rent reviews.

The play area next to the churchyard is leased by the Parish Council from Diocese of Derby.
