815 Planning decisions/applications received since last meeting & planning related matters

Decisions received: Appeal 32951005 – Land South of Church Lane - Redevelopment and enhancement of yard with one open market dwelling and workshop - Dismissed NP/DDD/0322/0396 Land South of Church Lane - Proposed removal of existing building at western end of site, and replacement with a workshop and ancillary office, including the associated change of use. Granted conditionally

NP/DDD/0922/1126 The Croft - New porch, replacement/amended glazing, solar panels and ASHP – granted conditionally

Applications returned to meet deadline: none

Applications for discussion: NP/DDD/1122/1370 Site address –Forget Me Not Cottage, Main Street, Chelmorton - Consolidation of 2 affordable dwellings in to one single dwelling

Council supports this application as allowing a local family to continue to run their smallholding. Whilst it notes this loses small affordable stock, the units were created for different family generations to live on the same site and the needs of the current generation now require one larger space. It notes the proposals appear reversible if a future multi generation division became desirable and is still a local need.

NP/DDD/1122/1446 Blinder House Upper Blindlow Lane

Conversion of existing barn into holiday-let accommodation and existing outbuilding to be replaced with a new traditional barn for ancillary use to the main house, along with associated landscaping

Council supports this development on the outskirts of our parish as an improvement to the site and with no overlooking or landscape issues in this remote location.

816 Footpaths and Highways and related issues

Overhanging trees on Church Lane reported in March FS-Case-409168852 have still not been cut back on the dangerous bend for visibility. Highway verge damage needs notification to DCC.
